NRWMAC – Who We Are

FOR OVER 25 YEARS, Nacimiento Regional Water Management Advisory Committee (NRWMAC) has been the voice representing property owners, visitors, and outdoor enthusiasts who enjoy Lake Nacimiento.

A NRWMAC director was co-chair for the original Nacitone Watershed Committee which was responsible for creating the 650 square mile watershed plan around Lake San Antonio and Lake Nacimiento.

Currently, NRWMAC holds a seat on the Monterey County Water Res Ops Committee which advises Monterey County on water control at the lake and consequently lake elevations.

- NRWMAC consists of representatives from communities and concerned citizens from around the lake.
- NRWMAC represents you by attending County and State meetings that impact Lake Nacimiento.
- NRWMAC is active in working with the "Integrated Regional Water Management Plan" of both Monterey and San Luis Obispo counties.
- NRWMAC views the current Monterey County Tunnel project as detrimental to Lake Nacimiento water levels and continues to monitor it.
- NRWMAC is involved with San Luis Obispo, Santa Barbara and Monterey counties, and State Fish & Wildlife to develop and maintains a consortium to address mussel prevention programs between the three counties and the State agencies.

- NRWMAC works with Monterey and San Luis Obispo counties to develop and maintain a comprehensive "Quagga Mussel Prevention" program around Lake Nacimiento.
- NRWMAC is the driving force behind the "Resident Vessel Program" for watercraft permanently kept at Lake Nacimiento. We originally created this program and continue to update and implement it to protect the lake for everyone's use and enjoyment.
- NRWMAC participates in training over 360 inspectors who provide vessel examinations at more than thirty ramps around Lake Nacimiento.
- NRWMAC has certified instructors who train Level I Quagga Mussel screeners, and teach all "Mussel Awareness Classes" in conjunction with the "Resident Vessel Program."






